COCHRANE SCHOLARSHIP

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS DUE 11/30/2020!

The journal Otology & Neurotology is seeking applications for 2 Cochrane scholarships. Funds (\$4000 per scholarship) will be provided to attend one or more Cochrane course in the US or Europe. Following completion of the course(s), the scholar will be expected to contribute a Cochrane-equivalent review or meta-analysis (topic of the scholar's choice) suitable for publication in O&N. After publication of the review, scholars will then be invited to join the Editorial Board of O&N to assist with editorial review of similar types of manuscripts submitted for publication.

The application consists of a typed, single page (no smaller than 12 point font) description of how this scholarship would contribute to the career goals of the applicant. The ideal candidate is a junior faculty member, though mid-career faculty and fellows will also be considered. Send the application via email to:

AMERICAN OTOLOGICAL SOCIETY RESEARCH FOUNDATION RESEARCH GRANTS AND TRAINING FELLOWSHIP AWARDS

SAVE THE DATE - LOI DUE NOVEMBER 1, 2020

If you would like to submit a grant for consideration of funding in 2021-2022, a LETTER OF INTENT and BIOSKETCH, including details regarding other existing support, must be submitted by November 1st of the year prior to funding. The next funding cycle begins July 1, 2021. The letter of intent must state the desired grant mechanism for the proposal (Clinician Scientist Award, Fellowship grant, Research Grant or Clinical Investigation), the Principal Investigator and Institution(s), a working title and abstract and include Specific Aims and a proposal summary (2-page limit on abstract and aims); BIOSKETCH as a separate document.

Complete applications will be invited from selected applicants based on the Research Advisory Board's review of the letters of intent. Applicants will be notified whether they are invited to submit a full application the first week of December. Completed applications must be received by January 31st.

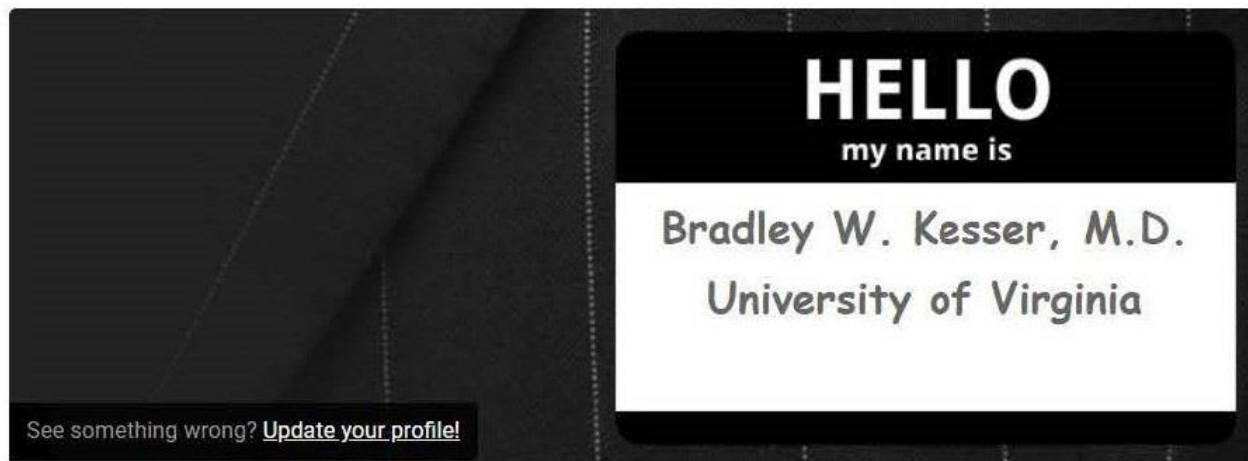
