**Operative Experience:**

This fellowship provides structured clinical opportunities for trainees to develop advanced skills in otology, neurotology, and skull base surgery. The trainee will gain competency in otology and neurotology/lateral skull base procedures at the main Duke University Hospital in Durham, at Duke Raleigh Hospital, at a satellite ambulatory surgery center in Durham, and at the Durham Veterans Affairs Medical Center.

A robust experience in lateral skull base pathology (vestibular schwannomas, meningiomas, CSF leaks), vestibular surgery (superior canal dehiscence repair, labyrinthectomy/endolymphatic sac decompression), cochlear implantation in both adults and children and a vast opportunity for chronic ear surgery is provided. As a division, the otology/neurotology faculty perform approximately 170 cochlear implants per year, with about 50-60 tumor cases per year (~80% translabyrinthine, ~15% retrosigmoid, 5% middle fossa). Hundreds of chronic ear cases are performed yearly.

**Call Requirements:** There is no in-house or home call. However, the fellow may elect to serve as an optional point of first contact for the otolaryngology resident fielding inpatient and emergency department consultations related to otologic or neurotologic disease.

**Research:** A meaningful, supervised research experience will be encouraged to enhance the clinical experience.

**Additional Information:**

Our fellows will gain practical experience in teaching residents at all of the Duke locations and the Durham VA hospital and have opportunities to participate in research that pushes the limits of knowledge in our field. The majority of time will be spent at the main campus (Duke University Hospital) in Durham, NC, as well as at the Davis Ambulatory Surgery Center in Durham, NC. The fellow will rotate with Dr. Calhoun Cunningham at Duke Raleigh Hospital (both operating rooms and clinics).
