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A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT Lawrence R. Lustig, MD

am extraordinarily proud to serve as the President of the American Neurotology Society this coming year. Once again the ANS is headed for a banner year. Our membership is at an all-time high, our finances are the strongest they have ever been, and we have a number of initiatives that will further strengthen the society.

I would first like to acknowledge the tremendous work by John McElveen, now past president. Under his tenure the ANS initiated a number of innovative projects, including moving forward with solidifying complex pediatric otology and neurotology under the umbrella of our specialty, successfully hosting the first ANS Council Mid-Winter meeting, beginning a surgical video repository, and initiating a complete overhaul of the ANS website. Our society owes a large debt to Dr. McElveen for his tireless efforts over the past year.

This coming year will offer a similar host of new initiatives and continuing work on these ongoing projects. Dr. Hilary Brodie is continuing to work on building up the ANS Research Fund, which will allow our society to seed research projects important to our specialty in perpetuity. Our goal is to collect \$250,000 and we have raised \$67,850 towards that goal. If you have not yet donated, we urge you to consider contributing to this important endowed fund.

We are also continuing to work towards having complex pediatric otology and neurotology acknowledged as a core part of our training and practice. While the membership clearly did not think a special subcategory of ANS membership was needed, both the AOS and ANS are working towards modifying the Neurotology Subspecialty Certificate as well as the inclusion of formal language in the description of the Neurotology Fellowship to include complex pediatric and adult otologic and neurtologic cases as a core of what we have trained for and do on a regular basis.

An additional project, headed by Dr. Yuri Agrawal will be to work with the American Academy of Neurology to examine outcome measures for the evaluation and management of dizziness, which will facilitate comparison of treatment modalities across sites. The ANS is also a sponsor of the upcoming International Facial Nerve Symposium, hosted by Dr. Bill Slattery and colleagues at the House Clinic. Additionally, we will continue to actively push to maintain our COSM meeting footprint on the Friday through Sunday timeslot.

Lastly, and perhaps most importantly, we are excited to bring our members a fantastic fall program. Working with Craig Buchman and the Continuing Education Committee, we have developed several panels focusing on such topics as unilateral hearing loss in children, an update on the vestibular prosthesis, and a panel focusing on emerging topics in auditory research. We are also extraordinarily excited to announce that Dr. Thomas Lenarz from Hannover will be delivering the annual Frank Rizer Lecture. Combining that with the Radiosurgery Study Group, the Facial Nerve Study Group, and the House Cochlear Implant Study Group, it truly does promise to be a 'Super Saturday', and likely the most educational day for Neurotology all year long. We look forward to seeing you in San Diego in September.

ANS/AAO-HNSF/HERBERT SILVERSTEIN RESEARCH AWARD



David H. Jung, MD, PhD, has been named as the recipient of the 2016 ANS/AAO-HNSF Herbert Silverstein Otology/Neurotology Research Award for his project titled, *"Novel Neurotrophin-Bisphosphonate Conjugates to Promote Cochlear Synaptogenesis"*. Dr. Jung attended college at

Stanford University, where he graduated with honors in 1997. After graduation, he completed a one-year pre-doctoral Intramural Research Training Award at the National Institutes of Health. Dr. Jung then enrolled in the MD-PhD program at Harvard Medical School. During his PhD, he studied the control of antibody receptor gene rearrangements with Dr. Frederick Alt at Children's Hospital Boston. Dr. Jung completed his otolaryngology residency and neurotology fellowship at the Massachusetts Eye and Ear Infirmary and Harvard Medical School. He is currently on staff at Mass Eye and Ear as an Instructor at Harvard Medical School. Dr. Jung has been a member of ANS since 2012, starting as a Trainee and is now a Fellow. 

Dr. Lin is an attending \bigstar otolaryngologist, neurotologic surgeon, and \bigstar

🛠 Assistant Professor in the UC Irvine Department of 🛱 Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery. Dr. Lin completed his 2 undergraduate studies at Harvard University and obtained his medical degree from the University of Southern California. He $\stackrel{\sim}{\sim}$ then completed his surgical training as a resident at Harvard $\stackrel{\sim}{\sim}$ ☆ Medical School in 2012 and as a neurotology and skull base 🔆 ☆ surgery fellow at UC San Diego. Following completion of ☆ \star training in 2014, Dr. Lin joined the faculty at UC Irvine. Dr. Lin \star has been an ANS member since 2013.
